May 1996 Issued P2 Goals

- ◆ Secretarial Goals for Waste Reduction: Achieve by Dec. 31, 1999 using the 1993 baseline.
- ◆ For Routine Operations, reduce waste generation by 50% for Low Level, Mixed Low Level, and Hazardous Wastes; Reduce Sanitary Waste generation by 33%.
 - For all operation, recycle 33% of all Sanitary waste.
 - Reduce TRI releases and transfers by 50%
 - Affirmative Procurement purchases 100%

December 1999 P2 Goals

- FY 05 Secretarial P2 Waste Reduction Goals issued in Nov 1999. Required routine waste generation reductions using the 1993 baseline:
 - 90% for Hazardous Waste;
 - 80% for TRU, Mixed Low-Level and Low-Level Wastes;
 - 75% for Sanitary waste; and,
 - 45% recycling of sanitary waste generated by routine and cleanup operations combined.

P2 Goals for 2005 and Beyond

- Sanitary P2 waste reduction goals issued in 1999 carry over beyond 2005 until 2010. This includes routine Sanitary waste reduction: 80% reduction by 2010; and Sanitary waste recycling: 50% by 2010.

P2 Goals for 2005 and Beyond

- Challenge: For new goals beyond 2005, in addition to the Sanitary goals already established for 2010 – What do we do?
- Establish quantitative or qualitative goals; a combination of these? Site specific goals based on site EMS's; or DOE -wide goals or both?

P2 Goals for 2005 and Beyond

- Future P2 goals will not be decided during this 45 minute discussion.

- The development and issuance of the 1999 Secretarial P2 Goals took a year and a half.
